
Main Idea



Procedure for Teaching Main Idea

- 1. Teacher defines the concept of main idea. Ex: "Main idea is the most important information in a paragraph or text that tells us about the topic being read."
- 2. Teacher explains how knowing the main ideas helps comprehension. Ex: "By identifying the main idea of each section of text, we can be sure we learn what the author wanted us to know from the text."
- 3. Identify the topic or character of the text from the title or within the first few pages. Ask who or what they are reading about.
- 4. Stop at the end of every paragraph or couple of paragraphs and ask students what is the MOST important thing they learned from what they just read about the characters.
- 5. Graphic organizers help with capturing main ideas as students read. Using the main ideas throughout the text help students retell or summarize what was read.
