Anglo-Saxon

Typically taught in grades 1-3

- Compound words
- Base words
- Odd spellings of high frequency words
- Inflections
- Suffixes

house, run, girl

Latin

Typically taught in grades 4-6

- Prefixes
- Roots
- Suffixes

Roots cannot be formed with other roots to form words. They can only be joined with prefixes and suffixes.

aud, dict, mit, miss, ped, port, spec, struct

Greek

Typically taught in grades 6-8

- Combining forms
- Related to science and math.

Can be combined with other combining forms to make words.

astro, geo, graph, meter, -ology, phon, tele



Latin and Greek plural forms often change form/spelling, e.g. metamorphoses, alumni

60% of words with affixes are from Greek and Latin origin.
