## Link the network

**Purpose**: Make associations within connected text by relating a part to whole or repeating a word for clarity to add cohesion and support comprehension.

## Procedure:

Teacher defines that semantic networks comprise words that fall into a similar category but are not necessarily synonyms.

- Teacher models through a think aloud the connections between specific words or phrases within a paragraph.
- Teacher will then guide students through a discussion of each of the words underlined and their similarities and differences to each other.
- Students will then sort the words into semantic networks using a graphic organizer.

## **Example:**

- Teacher will project the paragraph on the board and ask students to read.
- Teacher asks "What words in the following passage form a semantic network?
- Is it possible to organize these lexical links (content words) into just two semantic networks?

Most of her <u>spare time</u> Hanna devoted to different kinds of <u>exercise</u>. She particularly favored the <u>bike rides</u>. She would do both in the <u>evening</u> and on the <u>weekend</u>. Her new <u>racing bike</u> had not been <u>cheap</u>, but she even enjoyed riding it into town during her <u>lunch</u> hour.
